

JOSH OLIVER

JUST FIVE GAMES INTO THE 2025
CAMPAIGN, JOSH OLIVER IS ONE
AWAY FROM MATCHING HIS
SEASON-HIGH TOUCHDOWN TOTAL.

Oliver caught Carson Wentz's first TD pass as a Viking during the Week 3 contest against Cincinnati, giving Minnesota an early lead in an eventual 48-10 rout of the Bengals. Oliver scored his second TD of 2025 against the Browns in London, successfully executing a Vikings trick play in which RB Cam Akers took the direct snap and launched a pass to Oliver for the 32-yard score.

The 28-year-old also continues to stand out as one of the league's top blocking

tight ends. Oliver has been especially integral as Minnesota's navigated a barrage of injuries on the offensive line, offering another security measure in protecting the pocket.

9 FROM 6

Oliver hasn't scored a high number of touchdowns throughout his pro career, but those he's recorded have been from a wide range of passers.

In fact, the nine TDs to Oliver's name have come from six different teammates: Lamar Jackson, Kirk Cousins, Joshua Dobbs, Sam Darnold, Wentz and Akers. He's only caught multiple touchdowns from two QBs, Jackson and Darnold.

Hurts led the Eagles to regularseason victories over Minnesota in September of 2022 and 2023. His 81.5 career completion percentage against Minnesota is greater than against any other opponent. Today's matchup will be his first game at U.S. Bank Stadium.

Over the past five-plus seasons, the former Sooner has racked up 15,839 yards and 93 touchdowns through the air and has thrown 40 interceptions.

His passer rating over 83 games (72 starts) is 94.0.

Hurts has also scored 60 rushing touchdowns, holding the NFL record for most rushing TDs by a QB in his first five seasons.

FAMILIAR FACES

Hurts is plenty familiar with a couple of faces on Minnesota's roster, and not just as opponents.

Vikings defensive linemen Jonathan Allen (Alabama) and Jalen Redmond (Oklahoma) teamed with Hurts in college in 2016 and 2019, respectively.

Though Dallas Turner, Will Reichard and Walter Rouse share an alma mater with Hurts, they never overlapped with the QB.

Tommy Mason and Fran Tarkenton, who were Minnesota's first and third draft picks ever, put on a show in their second NFL season. Mason tied the game at 7 in the second quarter on a 1-yard rush. Tarkenton put the Vikings up 14-7 on a 10-yard touchdown. The duo then connected for a 74-yard touchdown to round out a 21-point second quarter. After a 42-yard field goal by Jim Christoperson in the third quarter, the Eagles rallied with two touchdowns to make it 24-21 Vikings. Tarkenton and Mason then put the game away with an 8-yard score.

PREVIOUS MEETING

SEPT. 14, 2023 | AT PHI | EAGLES 34, VIKINGS 28

For the second time in as many seasons, Minnesota visited Philadelphia for the Eagles home opener in prime time. The Eagles scored 24 points in eight minutes of game time from late in the second quarter until early in the third. The flurry included two 1-yard rushing touchdowns by Jalen Hurts, a 61-yard field goal after Minnesota fumbled at the goal line and a 63-yard pass from Hurts to DeVonta Smith. Minnesota made it close with touchdown passes of 62 yards to Jordan Addison and 10 to K.J. Osborn by Kirk Cousins, but Philadelphia added a rushing TD with 4:31 remaining. T.J. Hockenson caught Minnesota's first and final TDs.



FOOTBALL IS IN THE AIR

Forty-four years ago this weekend, the Vikings hosted the Eagles at Metropolitan Stadium, and both teams aired it out in a 35-23 win for Minnesota.

Vikings QB Tommy Kramer threw for four touchdowns, including three in the second quarter, and 257 yards, and Eagles QB Ron Jaworski threw for 330 and two touchdowns. Joe Senser, Sammy White, Bob Bruer and Ahmad Rashad caught scores from Kramer.

Minnesota RB Ted Brown added a rushing touchdown in the fourth quarter and racked up 92 rushing yards and 82 receiving yards. Philly counterpart Wilbert Montgomery scored a rushing and receiving touchdown and totaled a whopping 143 receiving yards on 10 catches plus 62 more on the ground. Wilbert is the father of Vikings offensive quality control coach Derron Montgomery.

History is framing Isaiah Rodgers' story. The first to do this. The first to do that. The fastest since ...

In Week 3 this season, the 5-foot-10,
180-pound cornerback emerged from
the secondary and shadows of his
past as the first NFL player
with a pick six, a scoopand-score and two forced
fumbles in one game.

He "played out of this world," said Defensive Coordinator Brian Flores, "for the lack of a better term."

Really, there is nothing more on-the-nose to describe the game Rodgers savored Sept. 21 against Cincinnati. He intercepted a pass and sprinted 87 yards for his first career defensive score. Shortly after, he forced and recovered a fumble and dashed 66 yards to the opposite end zone for his second defensive touchdown. Rodgers also rejected a jump ball while on an island against Tee Higgins, who has a 6-inch height advantage, and canceled a 15-yard catch by Ja'Marr Chase with one of his knockouts.

Grizzled vet Harrison Smith suggested an asterisk in the record books since Rodgers did all that in a half.

"What makes this story more interesting is my wife," former Vikings cornerback Xavier Rhodes offered. "She called my phone, she was like, 'Oh my God, I thought he had your record! I was about to get upset, but he didn't. I'm good. All right, I love you,' and she hung up the phone. I'm like, she is something else!"

Rodgers' first goal-line crossing represented the longest pick six by a Viking since Rhodes, who was coincidentally on site for Legends Weekend festivities, traveled the length of the field in Week 11 of 2016.

The three-time Pro Bowl honoree and 2017 First-Team All-Pro Rhodes was hanging in a stadium suite when Rodgers lived out "every corner's dream," gave Rhodes' wife a scare and made his mentor proud.

"He was always willing to learn," Rhodes said of Rodgers, who entered the NFL the same year Rhodes went from Minnesota to Indianapolis. "You have some guys that come in the game and think they know it all and think you can't really tell 'em anything, or they would sit there and act like they are listening to you and still do their own thing. But with him, he was a student of the game. He wanted to get better."

Upon their initial meeting, Rhodes said he thought "Isaiah was a great breath of fresh air."

"It's no ego with him. Zero ego. Like, he doesn't have an ego," Rhodes shared repeatedly. "You can go, 'Isaiah, I need you to be the kicker' – 'OK' – and he's gonna do it with a smile on his face. It's hard to find players like that, man. It's hard to find someone that's gonna give it his all no matter where you put him.

"That's why we gravitated to one another because that's someone you need around you," Rhodes said. "That's someone you need in your life, 'cause we're all gonna have bad days, and you're gonna need a guy like Isaiah that's gonna be around you to joke around with you, make you laugh and lift your day up."

Rhodes continued, "You tend to forget [about your blessings in life], but a guy like him, he's always gonna

remind you, 'Bro, we're here in the NFL, we're part of the less than 1 percent, let's live it up.'"

Rodgers has shared "office space" with elite cornerbacks such as Rhodes and Stephon Gilmore in his time with the Colts and backed up Darius Slay in 2024 for the Super Bowl Champion Eagles. Additionally, Rodgers has relished elite moments, cribbing a kickoff in his fifth career game, Oct. 11, 2020, and recording his second NFL interception off future first-ballot Hall of Fame QB Tom Brady on Nov. 28, 2021.

Everything pales, however, to what he has done lately.

Five games into his first season as a full-time starter, Rodgers is football's top-performing cornerback, according to Pro Football Focus (min. 100 snaps). His 82.2 overall grade is boosted by a 86.1 mark in coverage, as well as the first "perfect" game grade (99.9) since PFF started data collection in 2006. He's allowed only 13 catches on 26 targets for 112 yards, zero touchdowns and a 45.7 passer rating against.

"Personally, I just feel like he's going to do more," Rhodes said. "And once he's (even) more consistent, we're going to have a conversation of him being one of the best Vikings players or DBs they've ever had."

The success was anticipated by people close to Rodgers, like Rhodes, and college teammate Jordin Hamilton, who was a junior at UMass when Rodgers – "this super, super skinny kid" – materialized.

"He may have been all of 5-9, a buck 35 soaking wet, if that," Hamilton said.

"Seriously," Rodgers' good friend to this day emphasized, "he was tiny."

Hamilton said he doesn't think he saw Isaiah, or 'Zay', squat over 185 pounds in the leadup to his freshman season. He remembers training camp that summer vividly, though, because Rodgers was a blur in conditioning tests and an amoeba on defense, capturing passes left and right – like he was the target.

"I'll never forget," Hamilton reminisced.
"We had Andy Isabella on our team at the same time, who ended up being a secondround draft pick [in 2019]. He was by far the fastest player on our team. And then we're running 40-yard sprints and this new kid is not just beating Andy; he's dusting him. So we're like, 'Hold on, who is this little guy? Like, Isaiah, where are you from? Like, how are you fast like this?' "

Rodgers made a mutual impression on Rhodes.

"I wish y'all would mic him up,"
Rhodes said excitedly. "I think when
he's running, he's laughing. Like, I think
he's gifted to that point where he's not
running to his full potential. I think he's
literally that fast.

"It's like, c'mon bro, stop playing with us," Rhodes quipped. "You're making me look bad!"

Rodgers made more history while chasing Pittsburgh's DK Metcalf across the soft Irish soil. During Metcalf's 80-yard catch-and-run TD in Dublin, Rodgers reached a max speed of 23.32 MPH, which is the fastest by any player in the Next Gen Stats registry (since 2017). Staunchly, Hamilton said, "That honestly wasn't even a shock to me. He by far is the fastest human being that I've ever been in contact with."

Recalling Rodgers' debut camp at UMass, Hamilton stated, "His athletic ability was just superior."

Even then, with ample empirical evidence, some Minutemen weren't sold on the rail-thin cornerback making an early impact. Hamilton noted skepticism – "they were somewhat hating" – from teammates pushing for playing time: They doubted Rodgers' size, ridiculed his technique and reminder of his rank

Hamilton retorted, " 'Yeah, well guys, he has like eight interceptions in the span of 10 practices. I mean, how many interceptions do you guys have?' So from then on, I was like, 'This guy's gonna be a player.'"

A player, without question. But how about a playmaker.

UMass opened its 2016 season at The Swamp and eased Rodgers into the fold. They played Florida tough, falling 24-7 (the Gators leading receiver in that game was former Viking Brandon Powell). By the third game of Rodgers' freshman campaign, he was a starter, putting to bed concerns about his build.

"The plays he was making at his size and his age, I've never seen anybody do that before," said Hamilton, who works for a sports agency now and assists the high school scene, and whose father,

drafted in the

Conrad, was



intercepted Dan Marino as a rookie cornerback.

Rodgers finished his on-boarding year with 40 tackles, seven pass breakups to lead the IFBS independent programs (consisting then of Massachusetts, BYU, Army and Notre Dame), and interceptions against Wagner and Troy. It was a buildup to bigger and better. Over the next three seasons, Rodgers plucked nine more picks and recovered several fumbles. He racked up 242 return yards on 11 college interceptions; he took three the distance; and he emerged as a superstar in the kicking game, amassing an FBS-best 1,295 yards on kickoff returns and no less housed a 42-yard punt return, as a senior. Yup, a playmaker in every sense.

"Nobody expects guys from UMass" to make the kinds of plays Rodgers did Nov. 4, 2017, at Mississippi State, Hamilton expressed, singling out that game, on that stage, as the erasure of any residual suspicion.

In front of an SEC crowd clanging deafening cow bells, Rodgers intercepted two passes. On the first, he jumped a hitch route and cruised 29 yards untouched into the Bulldogs end zone, resembling his cousin Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, a 2008 first-round draft pick who had an inclination for pick sixes. 'Zay' maintained lockdown coverage to nab INT No. 2 on a trick-play deep pass attempted by a MSU receiver.

"By the time he got out of there," Hamilton said Rodgers "knew [the defense] like the back of his hand." "I believe that even if they wanted to line him up down at nickel, if they needed him to play safety at some point in time, he could have done it," Hamilton elaborated. "Now he may not have been the prototypical looking safety or nickel, but [he could have done it because of] his knowledge of the game."

When Rodgers was ready to swap UMass' logo for an NFL shield, he was already firmly on the radar of Flores, whose pathway from scout to assistant with New England (90 odd miles from campus) drew him to Rodgers making plays in multiple phases, as he was entering his first year as the Dolphins head coach.

Both men had to wait – Rodgers to hear his name late in the sixth round with the 211th selection, and Flores to coach someone he believed was an ascending talent. Historically, good things are well worth it.

"I was all in," Flores said this summer, rehashing his desire to acquire Rodgers in free agency.

"I'm happy we got him," the defensive coordinator added. "He's got a great football IO and acumen."

Rhodes and Hamilton are elated, too.

"I was talking to him the other day, and I was just like, 'I've had so many people reach out to me about [your playmaking] you would think that my name is Isaiah Rodgers and I was the guy out there doing it,'" Hamilton joked. "I'm just happy for him. I think that truly the sky's the limit for him. I know that people say that all the time when it comes to people's success

and things of that nature. But truly, I think that this year for him, whether it's this late in his career or not, I think this is gonna be a major turning point."

The joy for Rodgers has hit Rhodes hard; he delineated football's only promise is that it's Not For Long.

"He's playing lights out," Rhodes said.
"It's like, man, it's one of those things
where you put in all the work, and now
you're starting to see the results. Now
you're starting to see everything you
worked for, [knowing] all the sacrifices
you made. And now you're starting to see
the light at the end of the tunnel."

On the heels of his historic NFC
Defensive Player of the Week
performance, Rodgers flipped a simple
question – What'd Flo' tell you after the
game? – with a simple response: "I told
him, 'That's why I came here.'"

"I just knew, once I finally got my shot, whether it was Year 6 or Year 10, whenever that time came, I was going to be the best Isaiah Rodgers I could be," the 27-year-old said humbly. "I just think everything happens for a reason, and I think it's perfect timing for it to be now rather than earlier in my career where I was more of an immature player and don't think I would've meshed [with Flo'] and this system.

"So I think everything is perfect timing,"
Rodgers reiterated, flashing a radiant
smile. "I'm in the right state of mind,
and I just want to go out there and
make plays like he expects the whole
entire unit to do."

"Growing up, every Saturday, we'd go to the field ... and we'd be out there for hours. It was hard work, and he wasn't easy on me. but it's something I can look back on and be so grateful I had someone like that in my life to push me. And the opportunity that we had to have fun together resonates still."

THERE'S MUCH TO SAY ABOUT A MAN OF FEW WORDS.

When the Vikings signed defensive lineman Javon Hargrave to a two-year deal this past spring, former Vikings linebacker and current radio analyst for the team, Pete Bercich, said he jumped out of his chair.

"This guy is an absolute menace on the field,"
Bercich ascertained as he studied Hargrave's tape.
In the thick of training camp, returning star
Jonathan Greenard said, "I can't even describe"
the pairing of Hargrave and Jonathan Allen.

"'Gravedigger,' as we call him, man, he's a dog. I've been watching him since he was in Philly, so I just know all about his game, and to see it in-person – it's no fraud at all, man."

The nickname, issued to Hargrave spur-of-themoment by former South Carolina State Defensive Coordinator Mike Adams following Javon's first of 37 collegiate sacks, is perfect in origin. It has stuck like a bug in a Midwest summer – and now is perfect in Purple; 13 years and 47.5 professional sacks later.

During his first press conference with Twin Cities media back in March, Hargrave recognized the evolution of his position and money that's "jumped up for the defensive tackles who can pass rush."

Holy cow — and fortunate for him and the Vikings — does he do that well.

After a buzzworthy camp, Hargrave debuted in Week 1 as a starter for the defense he said he was enamored with when he was on the losing end of

Vikings wins against San Francisco in 2023 and 2024.

"Last year," he said in a hushed tone that juxtaposes his power-to-speed and speed-to-power pass rushes, "that was one of the craziest games I've seen, like how the defense came and played – sacking, catching picks and just causing havoc the whole game. I think that just kind of influenced my decision."

Hargrave's NFL CV, headlined by a couple Pro Bowls and Super Bowl appearances in back-to-back seasons on different lines – the Eagles in '22 and 49ers in '23 (both losses to Kansas City) – plus a history of making life miserable on opposing quarterbacks, was more than enough to influence Minnesota.

The Vikings, in an effort to more frequently invade offenses from the inside, welcomed Hargrave off a partially torn right triceps that limited his 2024 campaign to three games. His impact was instantaneous.

Together, Hargrave and Allen pressured Bears QB Caleb Williams 13 times in the season opener. Hargrave sacked the 2024 No. 1 overall draft pick twice; he stepped right and swam left to easily win a 1-on-1 matchup, crunching Williams in the pocket early in the Vikings fourth-quarter rally. Several

minutes later, after Minnesota claimed its first lead, Hargrave hustled hard to force Williams out of bounds for a 4-yard loss. His seven individual pressures surpassed former Viking Jonathan Bullard's tally across 17 games last season (6) and was approximately half as many as Harrison Phillips had (15).

Defensive Coordinator Brian Flores was specifically asked about the second sack in the aftermath. He smiled and said of Hargrave; "I believed he had the long speed [to cut Williams off]. I believed in him."



At 32 years old, 'Grave is the team's second-oldest defender (Harrison Smith, 36) and has earned the right to be a grumpy old vet, which Smith occasionally calls himself in self-deprecation; but you wouldn't know it by the way he conducts himself. To the perceiving eye, he's shy – smiley, kind and not talkative.

"Chill" is how Hargrave described himself. He's a country boy from smalltown Salisbury, North Carolina, after all. He seems exactly that, unchanged in terms of his personality despite a journey that's taken him to Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, San Francisco and now Minneapolis – big, bustling cities with chatter aplenty.

"He's soft-spoken whenever we're in a group setting," Vikings young defensive lineman Levi Drake Rodriguez said. "But once he's in that [d-line] room, man, he's a little jokester; you can hear his laugh."

It's akin to how he plays, the relentlessness he rushes the passer with – "contagious," Rodgriguez added.

Another young interior player, Jalen Redmond, tried to imitate Hargrave's "hehehehe" in good fun. "He's just a real quiet guy, which I like about him 'cause I'm kind of quiet around people," Redmond affirmed. "You hear that little funny laugh he's got, but outside of that, he doesn't really say too much."

Intentional or not, this take is true: Hargrave lets his play on the field do his talking.

"He's just a beast, honestly," Redmond said.

Hargrave has played 57 percent of Minnesota's defensive snaps across five games, the slight majority at right defensive tackle. He's tied for second on the defense with 2.0 sacks and leads Minnesota's interior defensive



linemen with 21 total tackles.

The in-game role is important, but so is Hargrave's purpose in practices and meeting rooms. It's not a coincidence that his arrival coincides with Redmond establishing himself as a force and Rodriguez breaking out as a rotational player. Both guys are picking their elder's brain, they said, and implementing things Hargrave does well to elevate their individual performance and of course the collective as a result.

"I'm a big mental guy. I like to see how people attack their day, how they take care of their body," Rodriguez said. "It's pretty cool to see; he wouldn't be this successful if he wasn't mentally tough."

Redmond, the Vikings sacks leader (3.0), trusts Hargrave for rush-plan tips – i.e. how he may attack a certain center or guard or how he does "his little step and swipe, which he defeats people with, and just seeing how quick he is off the ball," the ascending second-year player said. "It's been motivation for me."

Ironically, there's much to be said about someone who says so little. Hargrave doesn't have to tell you, though; he'd rather just do it. He sets the pace with his heat on the quarterback and warmth as a leader.

"We're all friends now," he said sincerely about the Vikings d-linemen in the dog days of camp. The life-sized teddy bear probably

would be friends with everyone – except opposing quarterbacks.

& THE POWER

Today's game holds deep meaning for Zoe.

An MVC rookie this season, the 22-year-old has had today's Vikings Crucial Catch game circled on the calendar since making the team.

"This game is so much more than football to me," she said. "It's a reminder of why I keep pushing forward through the challenges I've faced."

Zoe is considered a severe-high-risk breast cancer patient. Though she does not have active cancer, her day-to-day bears similarities to someone who does - and she is facing significant surgeries in hopes of preserving her future.

Zoe's story started five years ago, when at just 17 years old she was flagged during a dance physical for breast cancer symptoms. Though her initial care providers expressed concern and recommended an ultrasound at the breast center, a physician there dismissed her symptoms and assured her she would be "fine."

She recalled feeling defeated as she exited that appointment; Zoe continued to experience symptoms that included severe

pain in her chest but did not re-address them with a doctor until three years later.

She remains incredibly grateful for that day, when her doctor insisted on further exams and referred her

> > Stage 4 breast cancer and tested positive for the BRCA2 gene mutation, Zoe initially was denied a chest MRI and mammogram, due to her age.

Zoe's mother, however, was approved for testing and was found also positive for the BRCA2 gene mutation, which significantly heightens the risk for multiple cancers.

More than 60% of women who inherit a harmful change with BRCA1 or BRCA2 will develop breast cancer during their lifetime. By contrast, about 13% of women in the general population will.

Zoe finally was able to receive her own labs. She was positive for the gene mutation.

Zoe and her mother have



walked this journey side-by-side. They share the same oncologist and genetic counselor, and they've supported one another through painful testing, appointments, surgical procedures and regular MRIs.

The June before her senior year of college, Zoe underwent a triple screening appointment that included an ultrasound and biopsy, mammogram and MRI. She would soon be told the tests had revealed multiple lumps in her right breast, in addition to a stromal fibrosis in her chest that can lead to cancer.

"Although testing positive was emotionally difficult, it gave me the opportunity to finally get the testing I needed," Zoe explained. "I'll never forget the phone call with a genetic counselor telling me about the surgeries I would need, how I should have kids before 30, and how I could get a double mastectomy by 25.

It was incredibly overwhelming."

Since her initial diagnosis, Zoe undergoes MRIs every six months that have shown five clumped mass enhancements, some of which have grown, in her breast.

The stromal fibrosis and masses sometimes cause severe pain, even during simple movements like changing into her MVC uniforms or being inadvertently bumped by a teammate.

Zoe will likely have surgery to remove the masses before ultimately having a double mastectomy.

"Although receiving this type of guidance at such a young age is rare, it reassures me that these steps will help me have a healthier future," Zoe said. "My mother has already undergone one of her preventative surgeries, and I was there with her the entire time. Seeing her strength and talking with her surgeon was incredibly informative and gave me insight for my own future."

Facing this reality in her early 20s has been extremely difficult, and Zoe is deeply grateful for the love and support she receives daily from her family, her life partner and the MVC sisterhood.

"Having the support of my coaches, Jacie and Karen, means the world to me. Both inspire me in so many ways and are the epitome of strong women," Zoe said. "They motivate me to stay strong and to face these challenges with kindness and perseverance. Their support also makes me want to do great and be great for them and this team, even amid

all the challenges.

"This team has been so supportive, and I've built such close relationships that I feel like I can really lean on them if I need something," she added. A dancer since the age of 2, Zoe finds comfort and encouragement not only in physically moving her body but in the camaraderie of being part of a team. She danced year-round during her childhood and throughout high school, after which

she was recommended to step away due

to overuse injuries. Zoe pivoted during

her college years to coaching, which

kept her near the sport she loves.

"As I slowly healed, I used the studio to try things just for fun; and thanks to my love for the gym and strength training during, I ended up doing things during that time I'd never done before. That was right around the time I was about to enter a chapter of my life that would change me forever," Zoe said. "Dance stayed with me at the beginning of my BRCA2 journey and gave me purpose and drive to live my life to the fullest."

She added: "A long and healthy life is such a gift, and to be part of this team for even a small fraction of that is such an honor."

Up to this point, Zoe has traveled much of her medical journey with minimal discussion. But she's now decided it's time to share her story.

"I'm reminded every six months during my MRIs this is my new normal," she said. "With knowing the mission and cause behind Crucial Catch ... it just felt like the right time to share, ahead of experiencing this part of my life – and the game – together with my teammates."




