HARRISON SMITH

PLAYER SNAPSHOT

HARRISON SMITH is wrapping his 14th NFL season, which is ending with another Border Battle. Entering Minnesota's 2025 season finale, Smith has 54 tackles, three tackles for loss, two interceptions, one forced fumble, a fumble recovery and 10 passes defensed.

It's fitting the team is wearing the Vikings Classic uniform today, as Smith plays tough, old-school-style football appreciated by Vikings Head Coach Kevin O'Connell, Defensive Coordinator Brian Flores, Smith's teammates and opponents and fans across the league.

He's also well-respected by Vikings Legends, including those he's in a unique club with: 200-plus career games.

Smith played his 200th regular-season game earlier this season when the Vikings hosted

the Bears. He snapped a photo with Scott Studwell and Hall of Famer Carl Eller prior to kickoff and later noted the significance of sharing an honor with the two, as well as Legends Jim Marshall, Fred Cox and Mick Tingelhoff.

FOURTH IN FRANCHISE HISTORY

"The Hitman" intercepted Marcus Mariota in Minnesota's Week 14 shutout win over Washington and Detroit's Jared Goff in Week 17, pushing his career total to 39, which ranks fourth in Vikings team history. Smith is just one away from tying Ed Sharockman, who played for Minnesota from the inaugural 1961 season through 1972. Paul Krause leads the franchise with 53 interceptions during regular seasons in Purple, and Bobby Bryant totaled 51.







PLAYER SNAPSHOT

XAVIER McKINNEY has been a force to be reckoned with this season, making plays all over the field for Green Bay. The veteran safety hasn't repeated the lead-leaguining eight interceptions he nabbed in 2025, but he continues to be a threat in multiple areas.

Entering today's Border Battle, McKinney has 107 tackles (his second-highest season total), a sack, two interceptions, one forced fumble and 10 passes defensed, second-most among Green Bay defenders. The 27-year-old recorded three tackles against the Vikings in the teams' first meeting of the 2025 campaign, which Green Bay won 23-6.

McKinney hasn't made many mistakes this season. He's currently ranked No. 1 among safeties in tackling by analytics site Pro Football Focus. His PFF grade of 90.4 is the highest of his career thus far.

DURABLE DEFENSIVE BACK
Over the past three seasons, he's played 100, 98 and 100 percent of defensive snaps for his respective teams (2023 with the Giants and the past two seasons with the Packers). McKinney has been on the field for 2,120 defensive and 313 special teams snaps over the past two seasons with Green Bay.

Green Bay advanced the ball from its 42 to the Minnesota 38 but needed 57 seconds to gain the 20 yards.

Adrian Peterson rushed for 67 yards and a touchdown, and Adam Thielen totaled 67 rushing yards thanks to getting 41 on an early fake punt. Minnesota was limited to 99 passing yards for the game but leaned heavily on the defense for a 13-3 halftime lead.

Everson Griffen forced a fumble during one of his two sacks of Rodgers, and Captain Munnerlyn returned the football 55 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter to lead 20-3.

ITEM OF THE GAME



RIGHT APPROACH FOR *Mr. Wright*

There's a trace of self-deprecating humor in Ryan Wright's voice.

"I'm not a good golfer by any means," he said. "(But) I have some good shots every once in a while."

The Vikings punter has discovered applicable value in the gentleman's game. He frequents the links in the offseason, and he analogizes his bag of clubs to his burly right leg on his 6-foot-3, 245-pound frame.

"When I'm out there on the field, I'm really looking to hit that nice and easy 6- or 7-iron, whereas if you try to hit that driver, it can spray," Wright explained in mid-December. "I'll hit some shots and be like, 'Why did I swing so hard?' when I just need to let the club do the work. It's the same thing with my leg."

A collection of games and recent admiration for Minnesota's specialists (also long snapper Andrew DePaola and kicker Will Reichard) shared by Head Coach Kevin O'Connell confirmed Wright has made some good punts more than every once in a while: "They've been a huge part for us winning in a year where maybe we haven't [taken] the normal path that we've kind of been accustomed to either offensively or at times with some of the things we've had to navigate on [defense]," the coach said. "That one-play phase has turned into a massive play phase for us to try to play complementary football."

Like his counterparts, "Mr. Wright" is an unsung standout and a top player among NFL specialists.

Seated comfortably at a high-top table adjacent to the locker room inside Twin Cities Orthopedics Performance Center, the 25-year-old former UDFA reflected on 2025, a season full of personal highlights, with a punter's humility — uninterested in tooting his horn or circling a specific moment as his favorite.

Wright is modest, the requisite trait for a person playing an oft-thankless position. He doesn't gloat about his NFL season-long 77-yard punt versus Cleveland in London or his 65-yard "alley oop" at Dallas, which practically landed on rookie gunner Tai Felton's heels and bounced to the Cowboys 3-yard line.

"I'm prouder of just the overall consistency and the performance that I've put in this year," Wright said. "I'm a little bit smarter, my football IQ's a little bit better, I understand the punt play a little bit better. And that's just reps — having reps in the league and doing it at the highest level possible and just knowing what exactly I want to do with every single ball and having that supreme confidence to [do it]."

Wright's in-season routine hasn't switched up much from years past, he noted, but he feels like he is more homed in on the specifics of his job. He's not cutting corners, or banking

on his talent alone. He owns the complacency he showed after a strong debut 2022 season. He now wants to master his craft.

"The potential was always there for this guy," Special Teams Coordinator Matt Daniels expressed a couple of days after Minnesota's win over the Cowboys, reiterating what he said near the start of Wright's fourth season. "But I think the biggest thing [is] being coachable, having a growth mindset, trying to get rid of some old bad habits that we had — take the coaching and be able to run with it.

"Even looking back at his rookie year," Daniels continued. "The leg talent was there. There were just inconsistencies in his game, and so now he's found a way to stack positive performances and build off that, which has really given him a ton of confidence to go in and perform at an elite level for us."

Wright recalled dialogue with his coach/friend that was a harbinger of his breakout: "I mentioned to 'Hat' [this summer] I actually felt as strong as I did coming out of college for a change, which I think has really been helpful because I don't have to put as much into a ball to get the result that I want anymore."

Wright is a yogi and incorporates pilates; both activities help with his range of motion. He's been a huge power-cleaner since high school (no wonder his go-to punt is called a "napalm" — a "bomb" that whips left). He splits his focus throughout the week, drilling his footwork and his ball handling. It's important for

his line (the setup of his foot strike) to be habitual, like brushing teeth. He uses a short JUGS machine that blasts out balls at a lower trajectory to simulate snaps and strives for a daily average of 100 drops.

"I have my wife toss me some every once in a while," Wright said with a smile. "If I'm in a hotel room or my own bedroom at home, I'll just kind of spin it to myself, drop it on the bed. Just small things like that."

He has embraced all these idiosyncrasies to "play free" when it counts.

A major component is "visualizing where I want to put the ball, where I want my feet to be on the hash marks — on the outside of the hash marks — where this drop needs to be, how much it needs to be angled in and just really building up that muscle memory," he added. "Whether that's finishing my foot at the ear, whether that's having a relaxed arm ... just

[polishing] everything as far as technique goes."


The results of Wright's attention to detail and maturation as a professional are glowing.

With one game left on the docket, he ranks third in the league in net yards per punt (44.2) and seventh in average yards (49.0). Ideally, Wright's hang time matches his yardage — for instance, a 45-yarder reaches its destination in 4.5 seconds. His average hang is 4.48 seconds and is tied for No. 8 out of 32 punters with 20-plus attempts, per Pro Football Focus, and is 0.08 longer than his prior highwater mark set in 2022.

Maybe most impressive, Wright has synced power with accuracy. He's pinned 37.7% of his 61 punts inside the opponent's 20, and he has just three touchbacks on the season.

Wright has an easy time likening his success as a punter to his strife as a golfer because they're mostly mental endeavors. Regardless of if he's teeing off with his "napalm" punt or chipping with a knuckling "moon ball" or attempting to find the green from the fairway with a "banana ball" that spins sideways, his key is his preparation — the 100 drops and repeated actions — and a confidence he won't be denied.

"I believe in what I do," Wright said. "I believe that when I'm at my best, there's nothing a team can do to get a good return. And that's not just me, either. That's the gunners (Felton and Tavierre Thomas), that's the protection, that's the whole op — every person on the field.

Keep On Truckin'

The longship reached its dock with tremendous fanfare.

The 48-foot Minnesota Vikings equipment trailer, featuring a beautiful wooden floor and golden-hour glowing longship wrap on each side, eased into place at Twin Cities Orthopedics Performance Center at 3:15 p.m. (CT) Dec. 22.

The truck rested after completing its voyage to and from New Jersey hours ahead of schedule.

As the lift gate opened, the equipment staff wheeled out a large speaker, cranked up the tunes and enjoyed wrapping the final road trip of 2025 with gratitude the truck had returned so fast. After all, every minute matters in a short week that also included Minnesota wearing its Winter Warrior uniforms on Christmas.

Throw in a sunny day with temps above 35, and everyone was grooving to OutKast's "The Way You Move."

A few steps over in a warehouse, truck driver Terry Pernsteiner stood — doesn't that always feel good after a long roadie? — and summed up his thoughts after his fourth trip in five weeks.

"I have to admit, it's very bittersweet because this fraternity, this unspoken thing we talked about [with Vikings staff and employees from other teams] is very real, kind of familial,"

Terry said. "You know what I mean?


I do — both in terms of my normal duties, as well as the enlightenment from riding along with Terry to and from Green Bay, plus visiting with him at Seattle and Dallas.

"When the season ends, there's this vacuum," he explains. "It becomes so much of you because we invest all our passion into the season. You walk away and feel like a lost puppy."

Having not been on the trip to the Giants game (I feel a weird combo of gratitude and guilt, since it was such an ordeal for those on the team charter), I had numerous questions.

As Terry described meaningful relationships he's developed with Giants assistants, a downtime jaunt to the iconic McSorley's Old Ale House (Est. 1854) and Burp Castle ("We went to a whisper bar!") in the East Village of Lower Manhattan, the time spent waiting at MetLife Stadium for the Vikings equipment staff's arrival late the previous Saturday, and a favorite Pennsylvania truck stop with potato chips cooked in lard, Vikings Director of Equipment Services Mike Parson approached.

"Every equipment manager needs a great truck driver, and we've got the best in the business in Terry, because he's going to get everything there before he says he will, and once he



gets there, he's an extension of our staff," Parson said. "He's already ahead of the game by the time we land."

I ask how helpful Terry — and trucking so much of the equipment — was with overcoming the prolonged travel delay. The Vikings team charter neared Milwaukee on its initial plane before returning to MSP because of a mechanical issue. Eventually everyone and everything moved to a smaller plane that landed at Newark International around 11:30 p.m. (ET).

"It was great, because going to a smaller plane, if we didn't truck, we wouldn't have had enough room to put everything underneath," Parson said. "We would have been trying to figure out, 'What's the most important thing?'"

A ROAD WITH ROOTS

"We're heavy," Terry says before the first full turn of 18 wheels away from the loading dock. It's 6:20 a.m. the day before Minnesota visits Green Bay for the 130th Border Battle.

He'd know, and he's correct. An axiom established by former Vikings Equipment Manager Dennis Ryan is "be prepared for everything a player or coach could want." The timing of this game, along with weather's prerogative to change, meant hauling 39,000 pounds of equipment — setting a new Vikings record likely to become the general standard for late-season outdoor games.

This is as familiar of a trip as it gets, even though this is the first time the truck is making a delivery at the team hotel in Appleton before heading to Lambeau Field. He mentions that he's been tracking conditions for Snoqualmie Pass on I-90 in Washington for the following week's trip (another CDL driver also makes the long trips so that the truck can keep moving when Terry's hours reach their limit).

So how did Terry go from a modest upbringing in Medford, Wisconsin, to spending social time at training camp with Joe Montana and offering Dan Marino respite, or joining Minnesota for the international double dip in non-driving support roles since the NFL contracted Rock-It Cargo, which built its business with major rock tours, for logistics help.

"Imagine the guys that do rock 'n' roll bands. They're covered in tattoos and stories," Terry says as an aside.

Minnesota shipped some items well in advance of the team's Ireland/UK departure. Terry, by the way, has guided vessels through 7-foot waves on Lake Superior near Isle Royale and survived 14-footers while steering a Nordhavn near the Bahamas.

"The freedom, it was amazing. I fell in love with it," Terry said, pointing to his wrist and a shark's tooth necklace. "That's why I have all these bracelets. I was a competitive swimmer."

From high seas to highways, Terry keeps the wheels turning ahead of schedule to fulfill regimented requirements of an NFL team — but he also enjoys unexpected discoveries along the way.

His NFL origin story is rooted in how many squads formerly held training camps in Wisconsin. In 1991, Terry made a connection with the Chiefs in River Falls, handling their gear from the airport to campus and from campus to a scrimmage with the Vikings at the Metrodome. Unbeknownst to Terry, he was being evaluated at every turn, and after impressing people, he was brought in to help with the Vikings.

It's never been about money or fame. It's about building

genuine, long-lasting relationships and honoring his word. "When you grow up poor, you've got one thing: your reputation," Terry says. "You lose it, you've got nothing; and I fiercely hold onto to that."

"The interesting thing about sports and everyone around it is everyone is really honest and full of gratitude to be able to do this," Terry explains. "I did it for years for almost nothing. I used to go pick up the Chiefs, and I just wanted to shag punts and throw the football. I charged them 220 bucks to go over to River Falls and back to the airport. For years, it was so fun to be around. There was a time I could catch punts. Ben's a master. My days are over."

I saw you fielding punts on the hillside in Ware.

"Hahaha," he bellows. "That was pure entertainment."

I mean it's not the easiest thing to do on flat ground, and you were on an English hillside.


"Yeah, it's wet and the grass is long."

We just needed that visual by that point of that week. I was just standing there enjoying the scene.

"Everyone was. When I fell down, I was going back down to the grid, hit the flat and fell back. ... Andrew DePaola patted me on the back and said, 'That's what I like about you. You're old-school, tough.'

During free time the Saturday night before Minnesota's game against Cleveland, Terry held court at The Brewery Tap, circa 1509. He ingratiated himself as a bloke with patrons and the the pub's owner, receiving a special tour of a unique cellar space.

"I was with my mates. One guy was a bin hauler, a garbage



guy, and the other guy was a construction guy," said Terry, who also is a builder and developer beyond the NFL, where he's known as the first call for a team visiting Minnesota.

IMMERSIVE EXPERIENCES

During Super Bowl LII, Terry was the first call for both teams. "No one had ever done both [participating teams] because that's 2,200 (each team has 1,100 friends and family)," he explained. "You've got multiple flights. I got all my friends – 52 trucks, cube vans, anything I could get.

"The Patriots said, 'It's the first time in all the Super Bowls that every suitcase went to the right hotel,'" Terry continued. "I tell you what, there's some luck involved there: 2,200 pieces of luggage going to 12 different hotels. Sometimes the plane would come in and have seven different hotels.

"The Eagles asked if I wanted to be on the sideline with them. It was kind of surreal," he added. "After the game, the locker room has the trophy, shirts, hats – what an immersive experience!"

"Immersive" is perhaps the best word, as Terry likes to create experiences for others.

At the Seattle team hotel, Terry and Ben met Aaron Clark, a member of the Vikings 2025 Unified Flag Team. Upon learning Aaron's enthusiasm for big trucks, Terry offered the opportunity for Aaron and his father Kim to ride in the semi to the Unified Bowl at the Seahawks headquarters. Terry helped create forever memories for Aaron, having him sit in the driver's seat and pull down the cord to sound the truck's mighty horn.

Terry's a driver of things and a builder of people, living generously because he understands the privilege of making a positive impact on others.



Eric Wilson

MAN OF OPPORTUNITY

Eric Wilson just has a nose for the football. He's shown up all over the field this season, wreaking havoc for opposing offenses and logging career-highs in sacks (6.5), tackles for loss (16) and forced fumbles (4) through Minnesota's Week 17 win over Detroit.

"I definitely feel like I'm playing some of my best ball," Wilson said last month. "I think I'm maybe seeing football for what it is. It finally clicked in a certain way. Shout-out to my teammates; we play together pretty well, and coaches help me out a lot. I'm just glad it's coming together."

It isn't surprising to Wilson's former Vikings teammate, Anthony Barr, who recently spoke with "Voice of the Vikings" Paul Allen on his 9 to Noon radio show.

"It's just kind of what he does," Barr told Allen. "I've seen him do it. But it's just the opportunity. The thing about this league is getting a chance, and then when you get your chance, what do you want to do with it?

"He's one of those guys that always takes advantage of his opportunities," Barr added. "It's just great to see such a good dude, good person, great football player, great family ... see that success. I'm very happy for him."

Wilson has helped spark

Minnesota's defense, which ranked No. 4 in the NFL in sacks per pass attempt and fifth against third downs through Week 17.

And the thing of it is, Wilson wasn't necessarily slated to start when he re-signed with Minnesota this spring and returned where his career began in 2017 as an undrafted rookie out of Cincinnati. He played his first four seasons in Purple, initially making a splash on special teams and gradually earning more defensive snaps, eventually starting 15 games in 2020 and hauling in three interceptions. He joined the Eagles in free agency following that season but was released in November and claimed off waivers by Houston.

Wilson started the 2022 season on the Saints practice squad but was signed by the Packers in October; he went on to play the next two-and-a-half seasons in Green Bay, where he overlapped with running back Aaron Jones, Sr.

"A very underrated player. Every time I see him, I give him his flowers," said Jones, now in his second season with Minnesota. "Anytime I got a chance to play against him, play with him — he leaves it all out on the field, and you can see that, and it's contagious. His energy is contagious."

"And then when he gets the

opportunities, he plays his butt off. And you've never heard of him complaining, 'Oh, I'm not the starter,' " Jones continued. "When he was in Green Bay, he wasn't starting, necessarily. But when his opportunity came, he made the most of it, and things changed. It's the same thing here."

Wilson impressed during training camp on defense and special teams but was listed as a backup behind Blake Cashman and Ivan Pace, Jr. When Cashman suffered a hamstring injury during the Vikings opener, however, it was next man up.

Wilson answered the bell and hasn't looked back.

He's hung onto a starting position, joining Cashman, who returned in Week 7.

Jones noted young players farther down the depth chart would benefit by studying Wilson's career and approach to the game.

"I'm just super proud of him and continue to see the player that he's grown into, the person, and it's a joy to call him my brother and go to work with him every day," Jones said.

Vikings Head Coach Kevin O'Connell and Defensive Coordinator Brian Flores have been grateful for Wilson's play and leadership on the defense.

O'Connell recently told reporters he'd admired Wilson from afar before having the opportunity to coach him this season.

"You know, I obviously wasn't here with E-Wil previously, but I just remember hearing the way people talked about him, the type of person he was, the

physicality he played with, the football I.Q.," O'Connell said. "I was excited about the idea of bringing him back, just knowing that we had competed against him. He jumped off the tape to me, playing as many snaps as he did last year for Green Bay, and

O'Connell said Wilson has exceeded already-high expectations for being "a perfect fit" in Flores' defense.

Wilson has thrived in the system that bears some similarities to past defenses he's played in but still is its own animal.

"I love the ways that we attack," he said. "I like our style of play, and I like the guys on our team. I think we play well together — from the front, second, third level."

Anyone who comes into contact with Wilson can see how much fun he has in every aspect of the game.

From a sweltering training camp practice to a December walk-through session, Wilson has a smile on his face.


"He's a joy to come to work with," Jones said. "Every day, he's speaking to everybody in the facility; how do you not like a guy like that?"

Truthfully, Wilson just can't help it.

"I'm just super grateful, man. I've come a long way to get here," he said. "You've gotta love the game, and I love the game. I'm happy to be out here each time."

Though the Vikings enter today's game knowing it marks the end of their season, which fell short of their ultimate goal, Wilson continues to be thankful for every snap he plays — and to love what he does, no matter the outcome.

"It's just fun playing with these guys, man, in whatever game it is," Wilson said. "Win, lose or draw, we're playing together. The love we have for one another is awesome."



YOUTH HOSPITAL PATIENTS FOR HOLIDAYS

Oftentimes, people become starstruck around Justin Jefferson.

But during a recent visit to the M Health Fairview Masonic Children's Hospital, the Vikings receiver was the one in awe. "You're a warrior," he told 16-year-old Brooklyn.

Jefferson listened intently as Brooklyn openly shared with him her story, which included an attempt to take her life in July, ensuing medical complications, and an error in treatment at a hospital outside Minnesota that resulted in bilateral amputations below her knees.

Brooklyn has spent the past 21 weeks at the Masonic Children's Hospital, to which she was airlifted from the previous medical center, with her mother (and on many days, the hospital's therapy dogs) by her side. She carries an incredible strength into each day, which she demonstrated clearly to Jefferson during their conversation.

"We can't change the past," Brooklyn said, "and we're moving forward."

Jefferson commended her accepting the situation and showing fortitude in the face of such adversity.

"There are so many people that love you. We love that you're on this earth, sitting here talking with us, smiling. That means the world," Jefferson encouraged. "It isn't ending today, or tomorrow, or anytime soon."

Brooklyn visibly took Jefferson's words to heart, locking eyes with the receiver and nodding as he spoke. The two also chatted

casually about things she enjoys, their shared gratitude for family support and a mutual love of pups.

Jefferson posed for photos with Brooklyn and her mother, Amanda, and offered hugs as he exited the room, in addition to another reminder:

"You remember what we talked about, OK? Always remember."

Though Jefferson never donned cleats or a helmet during his visit, he so authentically exhibited what makes him special off the field.

Whether visiting with Brooklyn, spending time with 12-year-old Uriel who underwent a bone marrow transplant just last week or cheering on young patients in a holiday fashion show, Jefferson was present, engaged and uplifting.


"My family and I [never went through any of these situations] when I was growing up, so to talk to these kids and hear their stories

... it's devastating to hear about kids going through this adversity," Jefferson said. "I told them, 'Stay with it. Have that strong mindset.'

Lean on your supporters

... to get you through this tough time.' But for me to be here with them and to share those moments with them was everything.

"My day-to-day life is football — not really dealing with real adversity and the things they're dealing with," Jefferson added. "So taking the time to step aside from football and not really think about plays or what's going on with the team, but to think about what's more serious in these kids' lives — how can they enjoy this time, being around the holidays, around Christmas, and just have that joyful vibe — that's what it's about today."

A couple of years earlier she had mentioned to Theresa, "If I could go to the Super Bowl or be Fan of the Year, that would be my dream."

Theresa replied, "Well, let's make that happen."

As it turns out, Theresa was one of multiple people who nominated Leanne.

"If you know Leanne, you know she's a Vikings fan, period, first and foremost. When you think of who a Fan of the Year should be, she's exactly who I'd picture," Theresa said.



VIKINGS MOURN FORMER COACH & PERSONNEL EXEC

PAUL WIGGIN

Any of the achievements by Paul Wiggin were impressive enough to be life-defining. He could have rested on laurels long ago but loved working in football too much.

The Vikings are mourning the passing of the longtime assistant coach and personnel executive who died Dec. 12, 2025, at age 91.

Vikings Owners Mark and Zygi Wilf released a statement on behalf of the Wilf family ownership group in which they noted Wiggin's impressive contributions, including helping build Minnesota's personnel department "from the ground up."

"We had the honor of meeting Paul when we purchased the team in 2005, and it quickly became clear how much he loved the Minnesota Vikings," they added. "He captivated staff members and us with his stories about the history of the franchise and the NFL."

Wiggin joined the Vikings as an assistant coach in 1985 and remained with the organization for 40 years in a variety of roles in the personnel department after leaving the sidelines. He assessed linemen for scouting reports and offered valued counsel to co-workers.

Vikings Executive Vice President of Football Operations Rob Brzezinski began working with Wiggin in 1999 and appreciated Wiggin's wisdom and approach.

"Coach Wiggin is a legend as a person, player, coach and personnel executive. For 40 years, he demonstrated an incredible dedication to the Vikings, a team he truly loved," Brzezinski said. "'Wigs' was a humble man with a generous heart who was a mentor and friend to players, coaches and staff. Above all, 'Wigs' loved his family and was an incredible husband, father and grandfather."

Vikings Ring of Honor linebacker Scott Studwell played in 201 regular-season games for the Vikings from 1977-90 before joining Minnesota's personnel department and overlapping with Wiggin for nearly three decades. Studwell described Wiggin as a "class act who epitomized everything the Vikings stand for on and off the field."

"Paul was not only a great coach and dear friend of our family, but he was also a mentor to some of the all-time greats in Vikings history, and the respect he earned from his players, fellow coaches and entire Vikings staff was unmatched," Studwell said.

The modest man from Modesto, California, was a gentleman in every sense — yet effective in bringing out the best in his players. Just ask John Randle.

"Paul was the original guru. He had a quiet way of imparting his knowledge and wisdom in a way that changed the game," Randle said. "He never raised his voice or spoke in harsh words. His humble leadership pushed you to be a better player and a better man."

A two-time All-America selection at Stanford, Wiggin was invited to participate in the 1956 East-West Shrine Game. Drafted in the sixth round of the 1956 NFL Draft by Cleveland, Wiggin joined Jim Brown (1957-65) and Jim Marshall (1960) in suiting up for Hall of Fame Head Coach Paul Brown, helping Cleveland win the 1964 NFL Championship and earning Pro Bowl selections after the 1965 and 1967 seasons.

Wiggin was an assistant with the 49ers (1968-74) and Saints (1978-79) and head coach of the Chiefs (1975-77) and Stanford Cardinal (1980-83). In 1982, he endured "The Play" against Cal (known for "The band is out on the field!" broadcast call) and coached John Elway on the quarterback's way to becoming the top pick in the 1983 NFL Draft.

After helping with the 1984 Summer Olympics, Wiggin was hired as Vikings defensive line coach by Hall of Famer Bud Grant. Wiggin remained on Jerry Burns' staff for Burnsie's six seasons as head coach before transitioning to the personnel department in 1992.






